Building Regulations

This free workshop has been organised on behalf of Communities and Local Government to provide designers, contractors, manufacturers, developers and Building Control professionals with first hand details of the proposed changes to Part F.

The Consultation into proposed changes to Parts L and F of the Building Regulations in England and Wales was launched on 18th June 2009 and closes on the 17 September. For Part F key proposals include;

- Greater ventilation provisions for more airtight dwellings
- Improved inspection and commissioning of all ventilation systems
- Control of noise levels from domestic mechanical ventilation systems
- Results from a new study of ventilation and indoor air quality in new homes

This workshop will provide delegates with an explanation of the proposals and an opportunity to question CLG and their advisors. It will also provide a chance to discuss the likely implications of the proposed changes with a broad group of stakeholders.

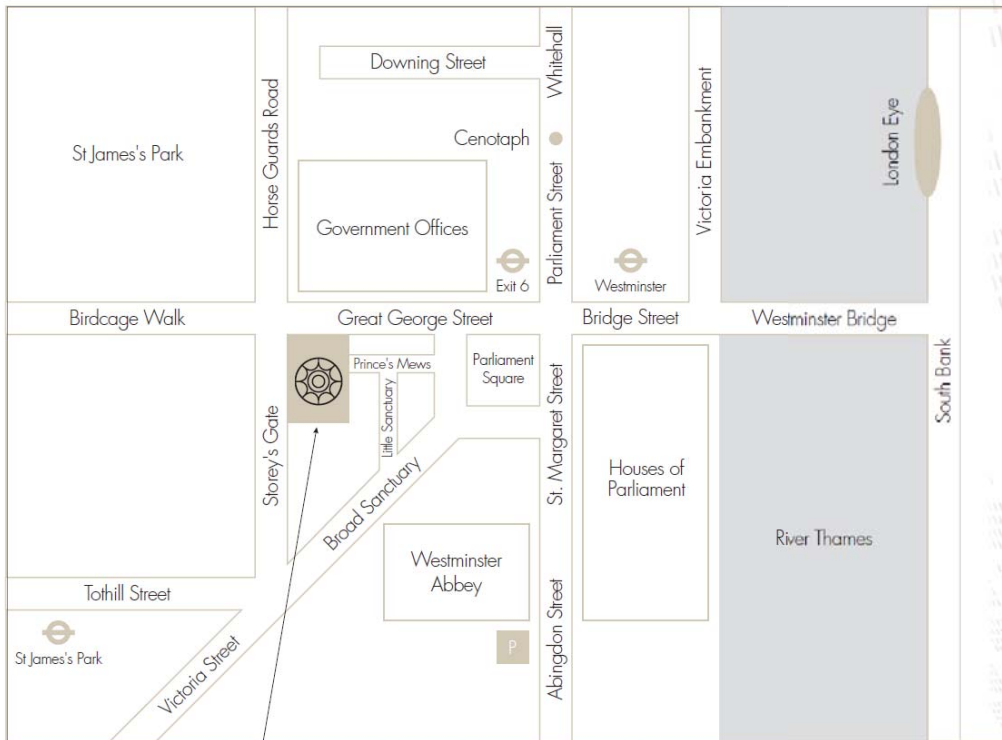
